Our learners learn and acquire language at different rates. This is a sequence of language that we aim to teach our pupils as they progress through our school. We do not expect all of our learners to be at age appropriate levels of vocabulary development due to their additional needs and hearing loss.

The Interrelated Dimensions of Music

- Pulse the regular heartbeat of the music; itssteady beat.
- Rhythm long and short sounds or patterns that happen over the pulse.
- Pitch high and low sounds.

- Tempo the speed of the music; fast or slow or in-between.
- Texture layers of sound. Layers of sound workingtogether make music very interesting to listen to.
- Timbre all instruments, including voices, have acertain sound quality e.g. the trumpet has a very different sound quality to the violin.
- Dynamics how loud or quiet the music is.
- Structure every piece of music has a structure e.g. an introduction, verse and chorus ending.
- Notation the link between sound and symbol.
